

### PARKING PROBLEMS

The Police have started to get complaints about the number of cars that are regularly parking on footpaths, causing an obstruction and a danger to pedestrians. It is appreciated that in this day-and-age that many families own several cars and the village roads were not built to cope with the amount of traffic it now carries. However, owners must take care not to park in a dangerous position or so as to obstruct the passage of pedestrians along the footpath. This is particularly important on roads close to the village schools. Your neighbourhood officers will initially be leaving advice notices on vehicles parked on footpaths and vehicles that continue to cause obstruction may be dealt with by way of fixed penalty.

### PARISH COUNCIL ANNUAL REPORT 2008/9

#### John Machin, Chairman Clawson, Hose & Harby Parish Council

During the past year the government have published a revised Code of Conduct, a Model Publication Scheme and revised the planning legislation for permitted development. Quite a lot for Councillors to absorb!

The combined Parish Plan has now been published. This was compiled from the village plans compiled by Harby and Long Clawson. Two working groups have been set up to implement and monitor its findings. The implementation group consists of four Parish Councillors plus myself. The monitoring group consists of the remaining Councillors along with members of the consultation groups from the two villages and I also attend this group as an observer.

Progress is being made in making sure that the burial grounds that are the responsibility of the Parish Council comply with Health and Safety Regulations. This is an ongoing process and provision will have to be made in next years budget for the repair of some of the monuments. The diseased trees in both Long Clawson Cemetery and St Remigus Church have been removed.

Discussions with the committee of Harby Village Hall relating to the granting of a lease to enable a new village hall to be built are progressing. Grants have been given to Harby and Long Clawson village halls from the monies raised in the parish precept.

Three of the overgrown allotments in Long Clawson have been cleared. The waiting list for allotments has not changed numerically from last year.

A survey was carried out to determine the requirement of social housing in the parish. The report recommended that two small schemes of seven properties for local people should be delivered in the next two to three years, one in Harby and one in Hose. The survey found that no new social housing would be required in Long Clawson. A further survey should be carried out in three to five year's time.

New play equipment has been installed in Long Clawson and Hose to replace equipment that was beyond repair. A grant was received from Melton Borough Council to help towards this project.

The Nature Reserve in Harby is now getting some TLC and the recent litter picking in Harby and Long Clawson helped to tidy the villages.
